




his son's education because they don't have



Moral: Money alone does not give success.






The Lasting Friendship 2




Moral: Don't compare your children with other children, everyone has their own talent.



Hema was blind. She always felt sad as she cannot see this marvellous world and also Lipsika, who was her best friend.



Moral: Neverjudge a person by their looks.







The Right Family 8



Moral: A good friend is equal to a good family






The Guiding Light 9






Moral: A good family always encourage good deeds.






The Milestone 10

Moral: Forgiveness and gratitude are the greatest gifts one can have.






Stubborn 11





Moral: Doing mistake is not at all a mistake but not realising it is a big mistake.







One's Own Talent 13


Moral: Sow a new plant but don't cut an old tree.



Moral Our parents never want our money but they only wish for our love.


